week. A decade ago, the figure fell to 38%, and it is currently at 30%. This decline is largely driven by the increase in the percentage of Americans with no religious affiliation — 9% in 2000-2003 versus 21% in 2021-2023 — almost all of whom do not attend services regularly.

Still, most religious groups have also seen a decline in regular attendance at religious services over the past two decades...

...On any given weekend, about three in 10 U.S. adults attend religious services, down from 42% two decades ago. Church attendance will likely continue to decline in the future, given younger Americans' weaker attachments to religion.

Specifically, more 18- to 29-year-olds, 35%, say they have no religious preference than identify with any specific faith, such as Protestant/nondenominational Christian (32%) or Catholic (19%). Additionally, young adults, both those with and without a religious preference, are much less likely to attend religious services — 22% attend regularly, eight points below the national average.

These trends are consistent with other Gallup indicators of religious beliefs and practices, including the importance of religion to Americans and formal membership in churches and other houses of worship. (Source: Gallup Poll Social News)

There may be many reasons for the departure of the faith: the lack of *true biblical teachings and understand-ing of Scriptures*, perceived and/or proven "hypocritical" actions by those within the faith systems, the busyness of today's families to provide for their families (financially, participating in family activities, etc...), traumas caused by trusted leaders of the church, church belief systems appear to be "obsolete" to today's generations, unrealistic demands/expectations of the church, people feeling judgment wrongly from those within the church system, to name a few. Whatever the cause(s) might be, Satan is deceiving many to leave their faith to follow their own desires and plans in an attempt to erase spirituality from existence.

What people don't fully understand is the eternal ramifications of their decisions to exodus from their faith: eternal separation from God. If people believe there is no God, there is no sin to atone for, so there is no eternal punishment. Even if people truly hold to this belief, *that doesn't negate the reality of God and/or His holy Scriptures*. If people fall away from faith because they are too busy watching "believers" and their failures to justify their departures from a relationship with God, they are going to be at a great loss of not only having intimacy with God but also all that God wishes to give to every believer. They will forfeit their eternal soul to believe the lies the world severely attempt to force upon each person.

The second exodus is also announced in the Scriptures

but this exodus is led by Jesus Christ Himself:

"Immediately after the tribulation of those days the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will fall from heaven, and the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then will appear in heaven the sign of the Son of Man, and then all the tribes of the earth will mourn, and they will see the Son of Man coming on the clouds of heaven with power and great glory. And he will send out his angels with a loud trumpet call, and they will gather his elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other..." (Mt 24:29–32)

In this exodus, it isn't the people leaving the church; it's the Church exiting the world! No more will Satan be able to harm those who belong to God because Jesus will gather all believers from the four corners of the world and this is known to many as The Rapture. When (and not if...) this takes place, those left behind will see the true impact of their disbelief in God/Jesus/Holy Spirit. Then, it will be too late for them.

How do we change the outcome of those in the latter exodus to avoid being left behind because of their unbelief? By trying to stop the former exodus from happening in our churches. Consider the following:

- Teach/educate the importance of our spiritual life Our spirituality isn't a myth, a "story" we share to control someone, but it's a reality that every person has a soul and God longs to have intimacy with us.
- Share God's love by example and live out its reality – If we prove it by example, others will see the reality of the beauty it brings us.
- Stop looking at others and focus on God As the Scriptures share, many will fall away from their faith. If we keep focusing on the lives and actions of others to justify our faith/lack of faith, we never get to see the beauty of having a relationship with God because of man's flaws.
- **Truly strive to find intimacy with God** When you look for God, you will find Him.

If you are in the first exodus and avoiding connecting with God, He bids you to come home. You are still welcome to come home but please do it before the second exodus... By then, it will be too late.

God's plan and His ways of working out His plan are frequently beyond our ability to fathom and understand. We must learn to trust when we don't understand.

The Christian Exoduses

As he sat on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to him privately, saying, "Tell us, when will these things be, and what will be the sign of your coming and of the end of the age?" And Jesus answered them, "See that no one leads you astray. For many will come in my name, saying, 'I am the Christ,' and they will lead many astray. And you will hear of wars and rumors of wars. See that you are not alarmed, for this must take place, but the end is not yet. For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom, and there will be famines and earthquakes in various places. All

these are but the beginning of the birth pains. "Then they will deliver you up to tribulation and put you to death, and you will be hated by all nations for my name's sake. And then many will fall away and betray one another and hate one another. And many false prophets will arise and lead many astray. And because lawlessness will be increased, the love of many will grow cold. But the one who endures to the end will be saved. And this gospel of the kingdom will be proclaimed throughout the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come. (Mt 24:3–14)

Many of us in the Christian faith are familiar with the story of Moses and the story of Exodus from Egypt. In

that story, we clearly see how God's hand of mercy fell upon the Israelites and delivered the nation out of the hands of Pharaoh. And many believe that such a story doesn't really apply to today's generations. I wish to challenge this belief and show you how we are amid an exodus today and preparing for another exodus to begin.



The first one I wish to address is the current exodus from the faith. As the

Scripture provided shows, people will leave the faith they currently have in the end times. Looking at the decline of church attendance and people claiming to abandon their faith systems:

Nearly All Faiths Seeing Declines in Regular Attendance

Two decades ago, an average of 42% of U.S. adults attended religious services every week or nearly every (*Continued on page 3*)


