Reminders from your Financial Secretary

Donations can be made to any mission of the church at any time during the year. Please designate the mission on the memo line of your check. If the memo line is blank, it is assumed you are giving to the general offering for church operation.

PLEASE MAKE ALL CHECKS payable to **SOLID ROCK CHURCH**. Your donation will be sent to the proper charity along with the giving of others from Solid Rock. No envelope is needed.



One check can serve a multiple purpose. For example: \$250 payable to Solid Rock Church; memo line reads “\$200 regular offering; \$25 Food Pantry, \$25 Kids Club.”

In January, your financial giving statement (for tax purposes) will tell you two things: what you have given as “church contribution” and also your “mission giving.”

If you prefer giving cash, please put money in an envelope noting the mission and also your name if you want it to be included on your giving statement for the year. If by check, the envelope is not necessary if the mission is noted on the memo line and your name is on the check.

If your giving is between you and God and you don’t care that Uncle Sam knows, just place your bills in the offering plate or the love bucket. Thank you. God will bless your giving.

Operation Christmas Child By Becky Brown

I volunteered in Texas on the District Team for Operation Christmas Child, sponsored by Samaritan’s Purse. I am going to share my experience with you.

In simple terms, members are asked to take a shoebox home and fill it with suggested Christmas gifts for boys and girls of certain ages. Once it is packed, the members return it to the church, where it will be prayed over and then taken to a drop-off location. Once all the boxes have arrived from the area churches, they will be taken to a processing center. There, they will be sorted and then shipped to the location where the children will receive

them.

When the children receive their boxes, a book will also be included. “The Greatest Journey” is a 12-week discipleship program for the children. Each child gets a book and is then given the opportunity to join the discipleship program. Many times, the children will go home and share the message with the rest of the family. All of the families have been saved through this program and through their child who has received the box.

We have found that the boxes always end up in the hands of those who need them most as if it is by design. I heard of an example where a child was an artist. She constantly prayed and wished for art supplies. When she received her box, it had the art supplies she had always wanted. Another child received a sock. Somewhere along the line, the second sock was lost. It ended up in the hands

of a boy who only had one foot.

A young man received a box and read a note from a girl his age. He kept the note and cherished it. When he had the opportunity to move to the United States, he had the name and city of the young woman who packed the box.



He sought her out just to say "thank you." A few years later, they fell in love, got married, and now they both work for Samaritan's Purse.

At our kick-off party, a young woman shared her story about receiving a box and deciding to attend the discipleship class. She was so enthusiastic that she ran home after each class to tell her family about Christ. By the end of the discipleship class, her entire family had become Christians.

I could tell you many more stories of how the shoeboxes have impacted the lives of the children and their families. I was always blessed when I saw the videos of the children receiving the boxes.

You do have the option of going online and picking items to place in your box. These are purchased and packed as if you were doing it yourself. You pick the age group and if you want a boy or girl. A \$10 fee is asked to help pay with for the shipping of these boxes.

to you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the offering box. For they all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on.”

Mark 12: 41-44; ESV

If we can share with our children and those new to the faith about the biblical blessings of tithes and offerings and their purposes, we can not only please God but also provide for the community we live in.

It is understandable that not all of us can give tithes and offerings in the manner we desire: lack of finances for the demands of our times, inflation, having questions if those who you give to will be faithful stewards of the finances you give, will the money go to the cause(s) you donate to, and more. We have a fear of future events, how they will play out, and their impact on our finances. We struggle with justifying giving tithes or putting food on our tables for our families. Trust me, I know the struggles sometimes. At the same time, we must also trust in God, as seen in the beginning passages from Malachi.

It should be noted here that tithes should be included in every aspect of our lives – spending time with God, doing His will, becoming deeply intimate with God, and becoming the hands and feet of Christ as we serve God’s will. We should teach children these important things because if we can’t give financially, they can offer God their time and talents as a living offering to God. Again, as we live this out for others to see, we bless them and God at the same time.

So, if you are considering what to share with your children/others, consider your own giving habits. Help them to know that giving to the church is a good thing to begin your tithes. What you give is between you and God. Teach them to be cheerful givers, that God will help provide for their needs, and that God uses us to help meet the needs of others. This will bless them and you as well. God bless you!

Weekday Religious Education: “By the Book”

Seventy-nine years ago Huntington County Council for Weekday Religious Education (now called the Associated Churches of Huntington County) was incorporated to promote and maintain released time at the elementary schools for religious classes. Now called “By the Book,” this program serves third, fourth, and fifth graders who, with parental permission, attend weekly classes held in “Bible Trailers” off school grounds.

Third graders learn that there is one true, all-powerful God who created everything and they are His special creation, made in His image. Fourth graders spend time in the

Old Testament, learning that God uses ordinary people to do extraordinary things, that He is faithful and keeps His promises. Fifth graders move to the New Testament and learn about the life and ministry of Jesus.

Third graders receive the “Jesus Storybook Bible.” Fourth graders are given “The NIV Adventure Bible.” Fifth graders get a children’s devotional. Currently about 850 students in six elementary schools are participating. It will cost about \$9,000 to supply these books this year.

Upcoming Firm Foundations studies

The Firm Foundations Sunday school class, which meets at 9:00 each Sunday morning in the church kitchen, is wrapping up a study on the book of Colossians. On October 13, they will do a one-session discussion of Bible translations. Why are there so many? What are the differences between them? Which translation is the best to use in a given situation? These are some questions that will be addressed.

On October 20, the class will begin a study using Randy Alcorn’s *Heaven* video series. What’s the difference between the Present Heaven and the New Earth? What will it mean to see God? Will we eat and drink on the New Earth? Will we know everything? Will we recognize each other? Will animals inhabit the New Earth? What about our pets? Will Heaven be boring?

Scripture does not definitively answer all these questions, but there are tantalizing clues. Randy Alcorn has written what many consider to be the most comprehensive book on Heaven. Using the videos and his book as resources, we will explore this fascinating topic about our future Home.

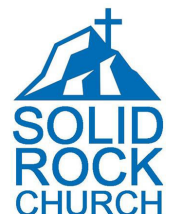

Children and Tithing

Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. And thereby put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts, if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you a blessing until there is no more need. I will rebuke the devourer for you, so that it will not destroy the fruits of your soil, and your vine in the field shall not fail to bear, says the Lord of hosts. Then all nations will call you blessed, for you will be a land of delight, says the Lord of hosts. Malachi 3: 10-12; ESV

Just the other day during the Small Talk with the children, I had a discussion about tithing and offerings. I shared what the offering plate was and why we give money to God. Some children didn't know why we gave to God, and some did. Why did I address this with the children? Was I trying to take money from children? Heavens no!

The topic for the talk arose from the recent Men's

Prayer Breakfast. All present discussed mentoring the people about spiritual matters, passing down wisdom to the next generations, and teaching children what tithing is at an early age so they can grow in their understanding of tithing; building the ability to give freely and joyfully.

I believe things like tithing, studying the Word of God, prayers, and so forth are what we, the believing parents, should not only be mentoring our children but also living out our beliefs for them to see the application of these beliefs. Children learn by example (and so do everyone else). Jesus taught the Disciples and the crowds by living out the examples He was teaching. One of Jesus' best examples of tithing and giving of offerings is the story of the Widow's Offering:



And he sat down opposite the treasury and watched the people putting money into the offering box. Many rich people put in large sums. And a poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which make a penny. And he called his disciples to him and said to them, "Truly, I say
