## Why do we light candles during worship?

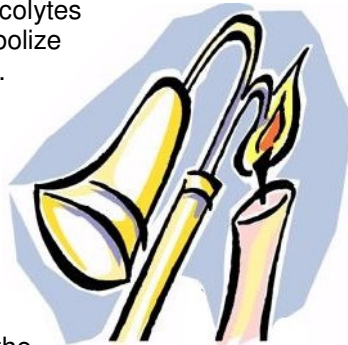
Jesus said, "I am the light of the world." (John 8:12)

The lights carried by the acolytes into the worship service symbolize Jesus entering into our midst. This act serves as a vivid reminder that Christ is with us, illuminating our lives and guiding our worship.

We have two candles on the altar, representing the human Jesus and the divine Jesus.

At the end of the service, the lights carried out by the acolytes symbolize Jesus going out into the world. This act reminds us that we are called to carry the light of Christ into our everyday lives, serving and sharing His love with all people.

Our use of candles in our worship service is more than tradition; it is a meaningful ritual that connects us to the light of Jesus Christ. As we light and extinguish these candles, we are reminded of His presence among us and our mission to bring His light into the world.



## Common ground

"Christianity was never intended to be a solo walk with God," says pastor Jeremy Basset. "A conversion to Christianity is also incorporation in the body of Christ, the church."

That's a fitting reminder as we observe World Communion Sunday in October. Christians don't take Holy

Communion alone; the very name of this sacrament refers to unity with God and others. We don't baptize ourselves. We don't learn Scripture or Christian theology and history alone. We can't have Christian fellowship by ourselves.

The New Testament is clear that one cannot be a solitary Christian. We are members of Christ's body (Ephesians 5:30) and "belong to the family of believers" (Galatians 6:10, NIV). As you gather for worship and receive Holy Communion, thank God for "our common salvation" (Jude 3, ESV) granted to all followers of Jesus.



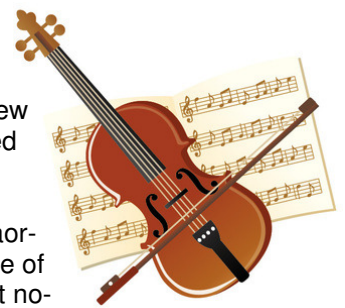
## The extraordinary amid the ordinary

A violinist once performed in the New York City subway, entertaining passersby for 45 minutes. A few tossed him cash, totaling about \$30 by the time he concluded.

Little did anyone know, Joshua Bell was one of the world's best violinists. That day, he played one of the most complex musical pieces ever written on an instrument worth \$3.5 million. Indeed, a few days earlier Bell had performed a sold-out concert in Boston, where tickets averaged \$100.

Sometimes God does extraordinary things right in the middle of our ordinary lives, yet we don't notice. You're offered an opportunity you almost pass up, thinking it's not worth your time or effort. But upon taking part, you find it leads to your life's calling. Or someone crosses your path, but overlooking their worth, you brush them aside, missing out on a blessing God had for you through them.

And what about you? Do you undervalue yourself as "nothing special," just an "ordinary" person? Look closer; think again. For an ordinary baby born long ago to an ordinary couple in an ordinary stable in an ordinary town was none other than ... God's Son! And you? Why, you are also an extraordinary child of God!

times that I've made promises to Him, only to let God down and to see the shame and worthlessness that I created within myself. Even though I know that I have been forgiven every time that I have asked Christ for forgiveness, my human mind, because of the nature of sin, continually challenges me to believe that I am worthy to be in God's presence. So, when I die and I do stand before God face to face, my greatest pinnacle will be when God holds me close and reveals to me that all of my sins have been forgiven could that be, because of the blood of Christ, I am found worthy to be in His presence.

What does this do for me? This motivates me to understand that I should not be pressing so hard to achieve the pinnacles that this world has to offer and to strive more for the ultimate pinnacle of being in God's presence. 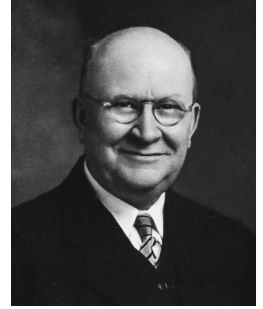
## Christ is enough

Though never ordained, H.A. Ironside (1876-1951) was a prolific Bible teacher and preacher. Inspired by Dwight L. Moody, he began delivering sermons at age 16. While still a teenager, he worked his way up to captain in the Salvation Army. But he soon had a breakdown from preaching more than 500 messages per year — and from feeling

burdened by sin.

After Ironside recovered, his ministry blossomed. He pastored Moody Church in Chicago for 18 years while continuing his evangelistic travels. Most importantly, he learned to rely on Christ alone, not on his own merit.

"Christ and . . . is a perverted gospel, which is not the gospel," wrote Ironside. "Christ without the and is the sinner's hope and the saint's confidence." He concluded, "For salvation itself, Jesus is not only necessary, but he is enough."



## Sabbath sight

Miners used to use mules underground to pull the loaded carts. Spending so much time in the darkness, some mules eventually went blind. But one old miner found a solution: He simply let the mules spend one day a week outside the mines.

## Where are Our Pinnacles?

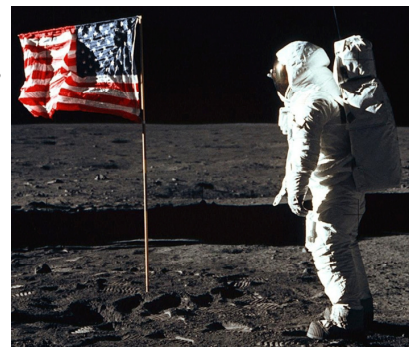
My daughter LeeAnn and I were having devotions together and the conversation led us to a discussion about pivotal moments and events in our lives. As we talked about a few of these things together, my mind went to Neil Armstrong's conversation. Someone had asked him about his landing on the moon and being the first person to walk on the moon and how to top that. Neil had responded, and I'm paraphrasing, that once you accomplish something that nobody else has done before, there's no greater thrill. Then he went on to discuss how he had attempted to recapture that feeling by doing various things back on earth. Neil reported that he found it difficult to experience that same euphoric experience at the same level that he did when he was on the moon. This got me to wondering...

I began to search my heart and mind to try to discover what I would consider pinnacles in my life. I reflected on when I married my wife, Marsha, at the births of my chil-

dren, graduated from college, became a pastor, and then a published author. And as important as each of these is in my life, and I consider them all pinnacles, I am reminded that I am on the quest for my greatest pinnacle: to fulfill God's calling on my life. When I became a Christian many decades ago, I had assumed that there was no greater pinnacle than this. And I must admit that when we become a Christian it is one of the top two greatest pinnacles a person can achieve. I have discovered that the greatest pinnacle is yet to come—my being in the presence of God Himself when I take my last breath on this earth and then take my first breath in His presence.

I try to imagine what it may be like when I first see Him face to face and it's hard for me to wrap my mind around it. I know that I will have some fear because I know that I know my past and all of the failures that I've given Him instead of obedience. I can recall the many

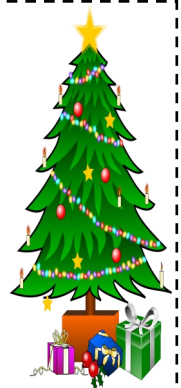

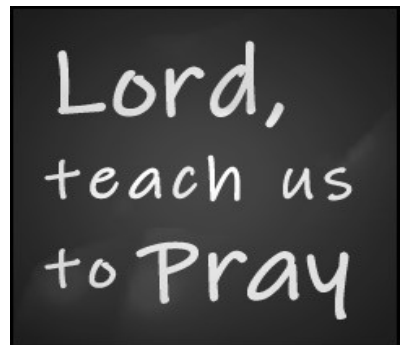

Prayer is the greatest, simplest privilege of our lives as believers.

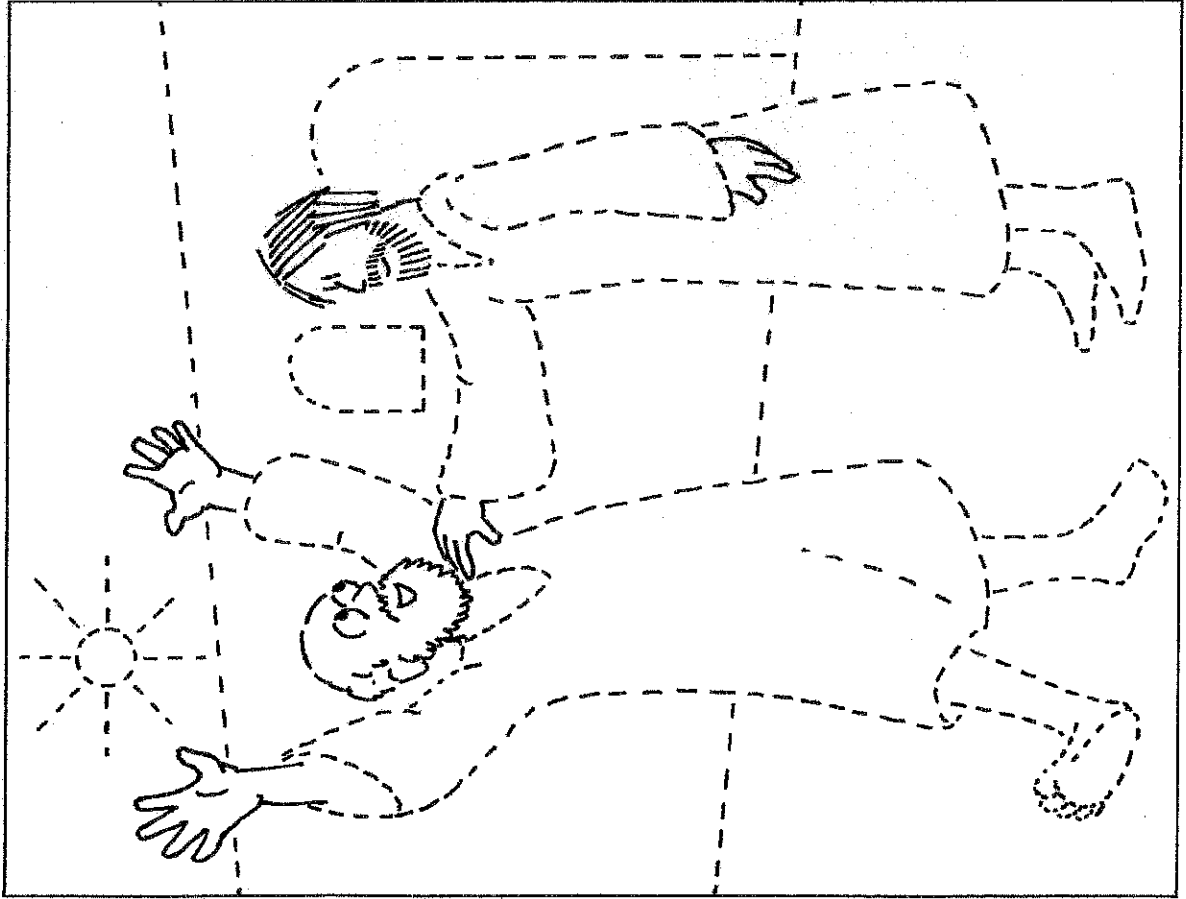
Thank you for continuing to pray for Solid Rock. Following are some special requests:

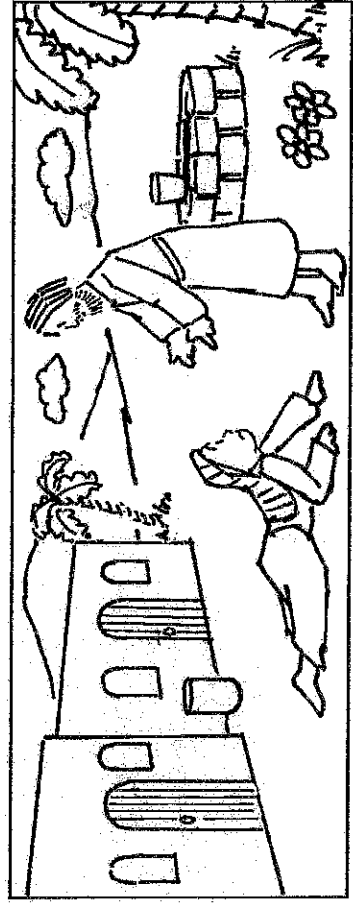
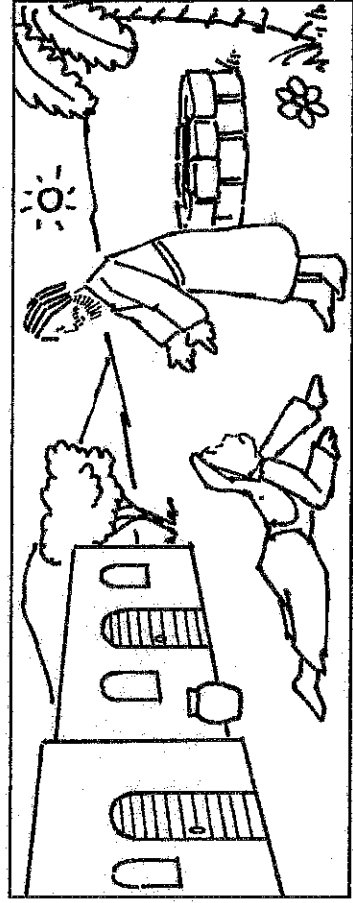
