Christ is enough

Though never ordained, H.A. Ironside (1876-1951) was a prolific Bible teacher and preacher. Inspired by Dwight L. Moody, he began delivering sermons at age 16. While still a teenager, he worked his way up to captain in the Salvation Army. But he soon had a breakdown from preaching more than 500 messages per year — and from feeling

burdened by sin.

After Ironside recovered, his ministry blossomed. He pastored Moody Church in Chicago for 18 years while continuing his evangelistic travels. Most importantly, he learned to rely on Christ alone, not on his own merit.

"Christ and ... is a perverted gospel, which is not the gospel," wrote Ironside. "Christ without the and is the sinner's hope and the saint's confi-



dence." He concluded, "For salvation itself, Jesus is not only necessary, but he is enough."

Sabbath sight

Miners used to use mules underground to pull the loaded carts. Spending so much time in the darkness, some mules eventually went blind. But one old miner found a solution: He simply let the mules spend one day a week outside the mines.

In a very real sense, God gave us the Sabbath to keep us from going spiritually blind. The Sabbath, as Jesus said, was made for humankind, but to use in sacred ways. It's our responsibility as followers of Jesus to decide how to best keep the intent of this commandment. How might observing Sabbath improve your ability to "see" clearly?


Where are Our Pinnacles?

My daughter LeeAnn and I were having devotions together and the conversation led us to a discussion about pivotal moments and events

in our lives. As we talked about a few of these things together, my mind went to Neil Armstrong's conversation. Someone had asked him about his landing on the moon and being the first person to walk on the moon and how to top that. Neil had responded, and I'm paraphrasing, that once you accomplish something that nobody else has done before, there's no greater thrill. Then he went on to discuss how he had attempted to recapture that feeling by doing various things back on earth. Neil reported that he found it difficult to experience that same euphoric experience at the same level that he did when he was on the moon. This got me to wondering...

I began to search my heart and mind to try to discover what I would consider pinnacles in my life. I reflected on when I married my wife, Marsha, at the births of my children, graduated from college, became a pastor, and then a published author. And as important as each of these is in my life, and I consider them all pinnacles, I am reminded that I am on the quest for my greatest pinnacle: to fulfill

God's calling on my life. When I became a Christian many decades ago, I had assumed that there was no greater pinnacle than this. And I must admit that when we become a Christian it is one of the top two greatest pinnacles a person can achieve. I have discovered that



the greatest pinnacle is yet to come—my being in the presence of God Himself when I take my last breath on this earth and then take my first breath in His presence.

I try to imagine what it may be like when I first see Him face to face and it's hard for me to wrap my mind around it. I know that I will have some fear because I know that I know my past and all of the failures that I've given Him instead of obedience. I can recall the many






