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The middle section of the passage from Isaiah describes the fragility of mankind. Even the youth – those who are supposed to be the strongest, falter and fail. Man is flawed and we can only do so much before our bodies give out. I know that in my senior years, I am no longer able to do the same things that I used to do. No matter how much I work out, prep, or whatever it is to get myself ready, I still can't do those things. And all of those younger than me might be able to do some of these; however, they too are limited.

The last section shares what can happen when God gets a hold of us and we place our hope and trust in Him and wait on the Lord.... This is a learning in progress as we rely more on His abilities and less on our own. The more we release to His care and understanding, the more control of things that will take place. How does all this help us to gain patience?

Every time I trust in my own understanding and abilities, I lose. Yes, I might think I am getting somewhere but the truth is I always find myself running in circles and getting nowhere on my own. You might think we would get a clue after several times of this happening over and over again, but not so. What I have been discovering is that if only I was patient with God and had patience with His timing, things would have happened quicker if only I hadn't interfered with my frail attempts to do it in my timing.

Patience is actually a gift from God. It might allow us the time to restore and renew ourselves and catch our breath. Having patience is a discipline not to be impulsive or too quick to move God's hand in a different direction than what He wants (as if we could move His hand...). I will admit I am still learning this truth...sometimes the hard way. And I'm not complaining because I want to develop patience any way God sees fit for me to learn!

I will continue to sometimes state NOT to pray for the "P" word, yet know this: I'm still growing in my development. I hope that you will begin to pray for the "P" word in your own life, your church, and your community. As God develops within you this prayer, instead of complaining, let's all rejoice. He is helping us by answering our prayer. God bless!


God's constant new work

Praying for the "P" Word

The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint, and to him who has no might he increases strength. Even youths shall faint and be weary, and young men shall fall exhausted; but they who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint. - Isaiah 40: 28 -31; ESV

I know what you might be thinking, "Pastor John, you've ALWAYS said that you hate praying for the 'P' word (patience) because God laughs...". This is true. However, I have been giving some thought to this. It didn't hit me until I was talking with someone about being patient about a situation they were going through. These are the words that I shared with the person and immediately the words clicked a switch in my heart: "If we don't have patience, how can we wait on the Lord?" Let these words sink in for a few moments.

How often do we find ourselves asking things of God and expect Him to do it "as of yesterday"? We claim to be

a people who wait on the Lord but not in His timing, our own timing. We want our loved ones healed NOW. We want help with finances NOW. We want our prayers answered NOW. Does this sound like us?


Look at the passage provided. The first part describes who God is and His abilities. A very impressive list of abilities I must say, and these are only the beginnings of His abilities. He never tires. God doesn't grow faint. His understanding is unsearchable. In



fact, He's the One who empowers all of us. This being said, it is He who gives us the ability to have the strength for the developing of patience. My own judgment is broken in comparison with God's judgment and timeline. Because He is all-knowing, God knows the best time for things to take place so that things will work out perfectly for all involved.




Prayer is the greatest, simplest privilege of our lives as believers. Thank you for continuing to pray for Solid Rock. Following are some special requests:

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
