
### Women of Worship

widow who couldn't work, had no one to support her, and that was all that she had left to give. Was it the amount that captured Jesus' attention or the faith behind it? I believe it was both. Jesus knew that was all she had to live on, yet she saw the needs of others as having more value than what she required. She gave to help others. At the same time, Jesus saw her faith and knew she was relying on God to be her Provider.

This brings me to you... You might not believe you have much to offer. Sometimes, we convince ourselves that since we don't have anything to give in the offering, we feel reluctant to attend church because we don't want to be judged or looked down on for not giving. We also don't offer our services or talents to God because we find flaws within us, or believe we have no talents in comparison to others who we think are more talented. Maybe we have been told we'll never matter, and so we believe that lie.

Your presence at church, in fellowship with one another, in the community, and in life matters! Here are some observations I have noted at our church:

- Your attitude matters Your personality may be the one that attracts people to you. You might be the one reason why people come to church to see what makes you who you are. If they see it in you, they will desire it for themselves.
- Your smile It's a reflection of the inner joy you possess. That smile might be the brightest thing someone has seen all day and it made them feel better because you showed them that they matter to you.
- Your talents maybe the person standing next to you does so because they enjoy your singing, your prayer, the way you read Scriptures, or share in Sunday School.
- Your compassion Might be the one thing that someone needs at that moment; a listening ear, a hug, someone to pray with/for them are some of the reasons others come to church or gatherings you attend.
- Your insights You might have a special way of sharing that makes things easier to understand, having a deeper understanding of something they are searching for, or you help them to know their way of thinking is on the right path.

I can go on, but I believe God will direct you to finding these things out. Your presence is important. You are part of the family. Your experiences can help others through their experiences. Your faith can help someone else's faith grow. Your compassion can bring healing in a broken world. You can inspire someone to do miracles because you have shown someone their capabilities. You are more important than you think!

Please realize that you matter to God and to us! We

look forward to seeing you, fellowshipping with you, and having you as part of our lives. Your presence in our lives matters to us!

### **Your Presence Matters**

And he sat down opposite the treasury and watched the people putting money into the offering box. Many rich people put in large

sums. And a poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which make a penny. And he called his disciples to him and said to them, "Truly, I say to you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the offering box. For they all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on." Mark 12:41-44; ESV


I have shared in a recent sermon about the power the Church Universal has in the world throughout time: building schools, hospitals, shelters, creating food banks, and so on. In the sermon, I asked you to consider what our world would be like if the Church had never provided the services it has and continues to deliver. Would we have these services in place? Would the world have people stepping

in to help make the world a better place? It's scary to imagine, and yet, it must be investigated.

Looking at the passage provided, you might think that this is an article based on tithing finances and that the

church (Solid Rock) is asking you to give more. However, this is not the intent of this article. This is to share with you, not just those attending Solid Rock, but to all readers of this, to encourage you to understand that your presence in our lives is significant in many ways.

The widow, in her eyes, had very little to offer: two mites or copper coins. To the church leaders, it wasn't considered to be a generous offering. It wouldn't buy a meal for



someone, couldn't pay for the supplies for the church, or even pay a portion of the religious leader's salary. It would never be missed. In today's world, it's like our penny; you can see one on the ground and no one would pick it up because it isn't worth bending down for. Jesus sees it differently...

Jesus knew the woman's circumstances: she was a
