#### Giving Up Control and Saying Yes By Becky Brown

How time passes! Whew! Two years ago, I had to say yes to God and be obedient. Sometimes that is the hardest thing you can do. Eighteen years ago, I had to say yes to God and move to Texas. That was NOT something I wanted to do. While in Texas God stretched, pulled, tested, and put me through intense training, but I didn't know for what. When he called us home, I was not ready to come back. I was in the middle of so many things happening in my life. I had developed friendships that were more like family to me. But, looking back, it was all about what I wanted and not what God wanted. Giving up control of my life is sometimes the hardest thing I do. I struggle with control.

In Job 22:22, we read Eliphaz's response to Job, "Listen to his instructions and store them in your heart." I was listening, but I was not obedient. Finally, one Sunday morning, I heard God's voice, and all he said was, "It's time."

I had a choice to be obedient or disregard God's wishes

It wasn't an easy transition. My daughter had to come down and drive my car back with a sick mother sitting beside her, sleeping most of the way. Satan caused havoc when we got here. The first year was turmoil, testing, and challenging.

Another problem I sometimes deal with is low selfesteem, which has been a problem all my life. Finding friends, a church, and people who would accept me (or even like me) was the next hurdle.

But two years later, trusting God and giving up control, I can see God's hands were in all of this. I have been restored, refreshed, and made to be God's vessel in whatever ways He sees. Thank you to the people of Solid Rock for your love and acceptance of my family and me.

Do you struggle with self-control and low self-esteem? Lay your problems down at the foot of the cross, trust in God, and be still. God's got this, and he doesn't need any interference.

wards the cluster of trees in the distance. I was unable to sense the alluring fragrance from the grove, nor did I note any such activity among the leaves and blossoms. Very few bees and hummingbirds could be found within its cluster. Some of the buds on the trees appeared to be withering and dying. My heart began to feel saddened by what my eyes beheld.

I turned back my attention to the single apple tree in the middle of the field. I discovered that where the buds once were, now ripe and mature apples are in their place. The tree was covered with an abundance of apples like I've never seen before. I went to the tree and picked one

of the apples. Taking a bite of the apple, its juice ran down the side of my lips and the fragrance from that apple was very appealing.

What made the difference in the harvest between the single apple tree in the middle of the field versus the apple grove? It was the



alluring fragrance from the blossoms that enticed the bees and the hummingbirds to come and partake of the blossoms. Their movements between the flowers pollinated the blossoms and enabled them to mature into a bountiful harvest. For whatever reason, the apple grove was never able to produce such an alluring fragrance to compel its much-needed pollinators to ever come.

Our churches are like those apple trees: unless the Spirit of God is allowed to grow within us, we will never have the alluring fragrance needed to bring others into the congregation to help pollinate the growth of the harvest; that is, deeper intimacy with God the Father. We have to allow the Holy Spirit to move within us and to change us in such a way that we become the harvest and that we feed the world around us from the fruit of this Spirit. If we do not have the Holy Spirit within us, we can never spiritually mature into the creation that God has created us to be, nor will we ever have the alluring fragrance to invite others to become part of the family of God.

I believe that I had this vision to be able to share with you what God wants to do within us to make our spirit more like His and to become a fragrant offering to the world around us that hungers after God. I believe that each of us as individuals is a blossom awaiting to be pollinated by the Holy Spirit so that its fruits will be made known to the world.

But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. Now the works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions, envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires.

If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, provoking one another, envying one another. Galatians 5:16-26; ESV

Those who do not walk by the Spirit are much like the apple trees in the grove that are unable to entice anyone to come near God. Those spirits who reject the Holy Spirit will never mature spiritually and will eventually die without producing a single fruit. It is crucial to our spiritual journey to be wholly committed to the Spirit of God and to utilize the fruits of the Spirit, and to allow the Holy Spirit to be the alluring fragrance needed to bring others into the harvest.

Remember: it's not just about the number in the harvest but the quality of the harvest as well.

#### Shepherding Moments

#### **Alluring Fragrance**

At a recent meeting with another pastor, we discussed our churches and the surrounding communities. We both shared how our individ-

ual churches were desiring to have a greater outreach in the community for growing the spiritual connection between God and the people. Each of our churches has unique connections and abilities in its respective areas, yet we also share common concerns for the spiritual pulse within the church walls. This isn't to say there are problems to address per se, it simply means we are both looking for ways to become more relevant to our communities.

As we shared, God began to give me a vision. In this vision, I beheld an apple tree; its roots were strong and deep, its trunk was wide and mature. At first glance, the tree was bare, hosting no leaves; sort of what it would look like during winter. This sight lasted only a few moments, enough for me to notice it seemed lifeless and barren. The tree was located in the middle of an open field, which gave

it a more distant appearance.

Soon, this same tree was growing leaves. Thousands of leaves sprang forth, giving the apple tree the appearance of a healthy and beautiful life. Amid the leaves grew tiny buds: flowers that gave off alluring fragrances. The aroma was pleasing and brought a sense of peace as I would breathe deeply. I was drawn closer to

the apple tree.

The closer I came to the tree, I began to notice off in the distance even more apple trees, but these were in an orchard setting and more clustered. They, too, had blossoms amid their leaves. Somehow, these trees seemed to have fewer blooms than the tree that appeared in my vision.

I continued to get closer to my first tree, and I began to see even more activity among the leaves and blossoms: bees and hummingbirds were going from one blossom to another. They gathered their nectar and danced from one to another. I looked over to the other apple trees in the distance and failed to see the same activity in those trees.

I took a short detour from my first vision to head to-






